Last Time Out:

Mystics vs. Sun (preseason) – Monday, May 14, 2012 (W 83-64)

- The Mystics were led by forward Monique Currie who led all scorers with 19 points. 10 of her points came in the first quarter where Currie shot 5-for-6 from the free throw line, 2-for-2 from the field and connected on one three-pointer
- Mystics forward Crystal Langhorne posted a double-double, scoring 18 points and grabbing 13 boards. Langhorne shot 8-for-13 from the field and finished with five assists in 27 minutes of play. Langhorne scored 12 of her 18 points in the third quarter alone, shooting 5-for-6 from the field
- The game featured five lead changes and six ties. The Mystics led by as much as 25 points in the game. The Sun led by as much as two points and did not see the lead again after half time
- The Mystics shot 18-for-23 from the free throw line, shooting .783 from the charity stripe. The Mystics also dished out 18 assists and out rebounded the Sun 40-26
- The Sun were led by guard Asjha Jones who scored 17 points, shooting 7-for-11 from the field and 3-for-5 from the free throw line

Mystics vs. Sky (preseason) – Thursday, May 10, 2012 (L 68-73)

- The Washington Mystics dropped their preseason opener to the Chicago Sky in a game that featured 17 lead changes and eight ties
- The Mystics were led by forward Monique Currie who led the team with 12 points, shooting 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line
- Mystics forward Crystal Langhorne and guard Natasha Lacy added 10 points each in the Mystics loss to the Sky. Langhorne also pulled down seven rebounds
- The Mystics shot 4-for-8 from three-point range. Rookie guard Natalie Novosel shot 2-for-2 from the three point line, while guard Rashanda McCants added 2-for-3 from behind the arc
- The Sky were led by guard Epiphanny Prince who led all scorers with 13 points. Sky center Sylvia Fowles added nine points and 12 rebounds in the Sky's win

Today's Opponent:

CHICAGO SKY

Series Notes: Last season, the Washington Mystics were winless against the Chicago Sky, dropping all four contests in their 2011 matchups. In their first matchup, the Mystics lost their regular season home opener for the first time since 2007. The Sky led the entire game, up by as much as 18 points heading into halftime. The closest lead for the Mystics came with 3:18 left in the game when they were down 72-75. Mystics guard Matee Ajavon led all scorers with 24 points, shooting 10-for-17 from the field. The Sky were led by center Sylvia Fowles who scored 23 points and pulled down three rebounds. Guard Epiphanny Prince added 20 points as the Sky won their second game in a row on back-to-back days. In their second match-up, the Mystics dropped their second consecutive game while the Chicago Sky snapped a three-game losing streak. The Mystics scored a season high 24 points in the fourth quarter but it was not enough to take control of a game that featured four lead changes and two ties. The Sky were led by Fowles who scored a season high 34 points and grabbed a season high 16 rebounds. Fowles shot 10-for-16 from the field and 14-for-17 from the free throw line. The Mystics were outrebounded 38-27 and shot a season low .077 from three point range (1-for-13). In their third meeting, the Mystics dropped their fourth consecutive game in the final seconds against the Chicago Sky. The Mystics were led by Ajavon who scored 23 points, shooting 7-for-13 from the field and 8-for-12 from the free throw line. The Mystics outrebounded the Sky 35-28 in a competitive game that featured 18 lead changes and eight ties. The Sky were led by Fowles who scored 25 points, shooting 11-for-17 from the field. Fowles also grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds, posting her 17th double-double of the season. Sky forward Tamera Young added 11 points, grabbed seven rebounds, and dished out four assists for the Sky. Young also recorded a career high in steals, collecting seven (previously five). Sky reserve forward Cathrine Kraayeveld shot 5-for-7 from the field and 4-for-5 from three point range, contributing 14 points from off the bench. In their final matchup, the Mystics lost 67-80 to the Sky. Langhorne led all scorers with 19 points, nine rebounds and tied her career high with five assists. The Sky were led by Fowles who posted a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds. She also added three blocks in the Sky win.

On the leadership:

"I've asked Monique (Currie) and Crystal (Langhorne) to step up in terms of leadership and lead by example and also be vocal leaders, so I think they have embraced that role. The other thing that has helped us thus far is that we have more veteran players and they are professionals and take care of business."

Team Notes:

Mystics Celebrate 15th Anniversary Season:

The Washington Mystics will commemorate their upcoming 15th anniversary season by unveiling a series of fan initiatives throughout the year. The metropolitan area's most successful female sports team was introduced to the Washington D.C. sport landscape in 1997 before tipping off their inaugural home game on June 19, 1998, against the Utah Starzz.

All-Time Mystics Team:

The highlight of the 15th anniversary season will be a digital campaign that will allow fans to vote for the All-Time Mystics Team. Online voting will start on May 19 and the all-time team will be unveiled individually during the Olympic break (Jul. 14-Aug. 12). The entire team will be honored on August 19, which will mark the Mystics' first home game following the Olympic break. Candidates for the All-time Mystics team include Chamique Holdsclaw, Murriel Page, Coco Miller, Nikki McCray and Crystal Langhorne to name a few.

Home Openers:

The Washington Mystics are 8-6 in regular season home openers. After falling to the Chicago Sky on June 11, 2011, the Mystics ended their three consecutive home opener winning streak in front of a crowd of 11,943 at the Verizon Center. The last time the Mystics dropped their home opener was on May 15, 2007 against the Connecticut Sun. The Mystics look to avenge last years' loss to the Chicago Sky in their regular season home opener tonight.

Preseason by the Numbers:

Last year the Mystics won both of their preseason games against conference rivals-- the New York Liberty 60-57 and the Chicago Sky 66-55. Although dropping their preseason opener this year to the Chicago Sky 68-73, the Mystics bounced back and defeated the Connecticut Sun in their second preseason game 83-64, leading by as much as 25 points. In both preseason games combined this year, the Mystics field goal shooting percentage increased to .405 up from .349 in combined field goal shooting in last years' preseason contests. The Mystics have also saw improvement on the boards, pulling down 39 and 40 rebounds in both preseason games this year compared to 31 and 34 rebounds last year.

Mystics Milestones:

Mystics guard Dominique Canty is 42 rebounds away from 1,000 career rebounds. Mystics forward Monique Currie is 100 points away from 2,000 career points. Mystics forward Crystal Langhorne is 31 rebounds away from 1,000 career rebounds. Mystics center Michelle Snow is six points away from 3,000 total career points.

Currie Back in Action:

With the return of Monique Currie back to the Mystics starting lineup, the six-foot forward has already made her presence felt this year. Currie led the team in scoring in both preseason contests with 12 and 19 points respectively. In their first preseason matchup against the Chicago Sky, Currie scored 12 points, shooting 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line in 23 minutes of play. In their second preseason contest, Currie led all scorers with 19 points, with 10 coming in the first quarter alone. Currie shot 6-for-9 from the field, 2-for-2 from three-point range, and 5-for-6 from the free throw line. Currie also grabbed two rebounds and collected two steals in 22 minutes of play in the Mystics 83-64 victory over the Connecticut Sun.

2012 Draft Picks:

The Washington Mystics selected Natalie Novosel from the University of Notre Dame and LaSondra Barrett from Louisiana State University with the eighth and 10th overall picks in the 2012 WNBA draft. The last time Washington had two first round selections was in 2002 when the team drafted Stacey Dales and Asjha Jones with the third and fourth overall picks. A 5-11 guard, Novosel was instrumental in helping the Fighting Irish compete in back-to-back National Championships. She averaged 10.7 points and 3.3 rebounds per game over her career, led the Big East conference in both three-point field goals and free throw percentages, and was named to consecutive All-Big East First Team. Novosel was also an AP All-America Honorable Mention recipient and a Wade Trophy finalist. In 2011, she set a school record for most free throws made (183). A 6-2 forward, Barrett was named to the All-SEC First Team and was a Wade Trophy finalist. Her career averages include 12.2 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. Barrett is one of only 17 players in school history with 1,000 points and 500 rebounds. She has also earned various academic honors throughout her collegiate career.

Spring Cleaning:

With a busy off-season full of trades, signings, and draft picks, the Washington Mystics roster consists of only four returning players from last season—Matee Ajavon, Monique Currie, Crystal Langhorne and Jasmine Thomas.

Mystics Acquire Noelle Quinn:

On February 1, 2012, the Washington Mystics acquired veteran guard Noelle Quinn from the Los Angeles Sparks in exchange for forward Marissa Coleman. A 6-0 standout from UCLA, Quinn was selected by the Minnesota Lynx in the first round (fourth overall) of the 2007 WNBA Draft. She spent two seasons with the Lynx where she averaged 3.2 points and 3.4 assists per game. During her rookie season, Quinn dished a career high 14 assists. For the last three seasons, Quinn has been a member of the Sparks and helped lead them to consecutive playoff appearances in 2009 and 2010. In 2011, Quinn led the WNBA in assists per turnover ratio (2.7). She posted career highs in points (10.2), rebounds (4.0), games started (34) and minutes (32.5) in 2010.

Michelle Snow Joins Mystics:

On February 9, 2012, the Washington Mystics signed free agent center Michelle Snow. A 10-year veteran, Snow has averaged 9.0 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.0 blocks in 334 career games with the Houston Comets, Atlanta Dream, San Antonio Silver Stars and most recently, the Chicago Sky. Last season with the Chicago Sky, Snow averaged 5.9 points and 6.3 rebounds and ranked fifth in the league with 1.3 blocks per game. She is currently eighth among the WNBA's all-time leaders in blocks (350). During her seven years with the Comets, Snow help lead Houston to four playoff appearances (2002, 2003, 2005, 2006). In 2003, after averaging 9.9 points, 7.7 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game, she was named the WNBA's Most Improved Player. In addition, she made consecutive All-Star appearances in 2005 and 2006. Snow helped the Dream secure the first playoff berth in franchise history during her time in Atlanta and was a part of the Silver Stars' playoff squad in 2010. Overall, she holds averages of 8.8 points, 6.2 and 1.0 blocks in 17 playoff games.

Inova Health System Marquee Partnership Continues:

On April 19, 2012, the Washington Mystics announced that the team will continue their marquee partnership with Inova for a second consecutive year. Mystics players will again wear Inova's name and logo on the front of their home and away jerseys, shooting shirts and community apparel during the upcoming 2012 WNBA season. New to the partnership is Inova's involvement with the team's annual Breast Health Awareness Game to be held on Sunday, September 16, at 4:00 p.m. The Mystics have raised over \$180,000 for breast cancer initiatives over the past four seasons. Inova will remain the presenting partner of the Washington Mystics and Wizards Youth Basketball Camps and will receive co-branding on signage pertaining to camps and clinics, in-arena recognition at all Mystics and Wizards home games and presence in marketing and social media platforms.

Coaches Corner:

On January 17, 2012, Jennifer Gillom joined the Washington Mystics coaching staff. A pioneer in the women's game, Gillom was elected to the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2009. Gillom spent seven years in the WNBA, playing for the Phoenix Mercury and the Los Angeles Sparks. She will also serve as an assistant coach for USA Basketball during the upcoming summer Olympics.

Monumental Sports:

The WNBA's Washington Mystics are owned and operated by Monumental Sports & Entertainment, which is one of the largest integrated sports and entertainment companies in the country with one of the most diverse partnership groups in all of sports. She was named USA Basketball's 1985 Female Athlete of the Year and collected a total of six gold medals including the 1988 Olympic Games, plus one silver medal as a member of USA Basketball.
